The strong growth of African studies in recent years reflects the impact of African states and African issues on world affairs. Existing collections of documents on African affairs have a marked historical aspect, and many important contemporary documents are not easily accessible even in specialized libraries. This volume is intended to fill a gap in the literature by a collection which will be useful and handy. The subjects dealt with include African intergovernmental organizations, economic development, territorial problems, self-determination and racial discrimination in Southern Africa, and relations with non-African powers.
